From the Deacons' bench

As a church we have been supporting the Shippensburg Community Cares family shelter for some time. The Deacons help to facilitate this effort by taking your donations to the shelter and by staying atop their needs.

The shelter is located at 206 E. Burd Street in Shippensburg. There is room for up to 8 families a day. Each family is given their own room, sink and toilet with shared shower and kitchen facilities. There is a kids playroom, conference/homework room, and another room for clothing and regular hygiene supplies.

Middle Spring partners with many other agencies to assist in providing food support, transportation, employment, budget building, housing search and much more. Please note that there is a continuing need for the supplies the Deacons gather and then deliver to the shelter on the first Sunday of each month. So we continue to ask for donations of cooking oil, bleach, washcloths and towels and other cleaning supplies, toiletries, dry/canned goods, and children's snacks. We are also adding blankets to this list of needs.

What a privilege to assist in providing a safe, healthy and comfortable environment for those that need it until they can get back on their feet.

The February Session meeting was held on February 4, 2025, at 6:00 PM in the library/classroom. Park Bierbower led the Session in devotions and opened the meeting with prayer.

The Spring Congregational Meeting will be held on Sunday, February 16, 2025, immediately following worship. The purpose of the meeting is to hear the 2025 financial data and the 2024 membership statistics.

A Congregational Gathering has been scheduled for Sunday, May 18, 2025, immediately following worship to hear what the congregation likes/dislikes about the Outreach/Fellowship events that have been held and to brainstorm new ideas.

A new event was added to the planned programs of the Outreach/Fellowship Team. Rose Leitner will present a concert on Saturday, June 14, 2025, at 7:00 PM.

An Organist swap will be held on Sunday, February 23, 2025, with Phil Shuman from the King Street United Brethren Church coming to Middle Spring and Ingrid will be playing at the King Street church. No cost to either church.

The Alarm System was malfunctioning and has since been repaired.

Seven dead or injured trees were cut down by Zook Tree Service for \$2400. A fence row belonging to the Cemetery Association was also removed. The Cemetery Association paid \$600 for the removal of the fence.

A discussion was held about the possibility of having a Junior Church during worship.

The Youth Group will be traveling to Bloomington, IL on July 12-19 for their Mission trip this summer. The silent auction and chicken bar-b-que will be held on Saturday, April 12, 2025.

At the January 23 Community Meal, 2 in-person meals were served, 61 drive-thru meals were served, and 35 meals were given to the Family Shelter.

The **Presbyterian Women's Bible Study** will meet at 1:00 on Tuesday, March 18 in the library. We will continue with Lesson #4 from <u>The Book of Malachi</u>.

The Adult Sunday School Class meets every Sunday morning at 9:15 am in the Fellowship Hall. We are studying from the Life Guide Bible Series called "Meeting the Spirit." We will be examining key passages of scripture that will teach us vital truths about who the Spirit of God is and what he is anxious to do in our lives. Be prepared to be changed! We are adding to

our numbers and have very meaningful conversations that help us grow in our faith. Come, you will be so glad you did.

The Tuesday morning Zoom Bible study group would like to encourage members of the congregation to join us for our Lenten study. We will begin this study on Tuesday March 4th and continue each Tuesday through April 15th. We will be using a study from Right Now Media, the "Lent Experience" by Eric Ferris.



Each week we will view a video and use the daily devotional journal that accompanies it to aid in our discussion of that week's topic. Right Now Media is available on line to all church members. If you are unable to join us on Zoom and would like to pursue this study independently you may do so by going online. The devotionals can be ordered through the church office whether you are planning to join us or will be doing the study on your own.

A brief explanation of the study from Right Now Media follows:

"What happens when you take 2000 years of a Christian tradition, capture the heart of it and reimagine it? Whether you're a veteran of observing Lent or a rookie who is jumping in for the first time, you can join thousands of people for an experience that just may surprise you. It's simple, you watch a video on Ash Wednesday that kicks the whole thing off. Then each Sunday until Easter you will watch a short video that will give your Lent challenge for the week. The challenges are based on things that have been a part of Lent for centuries. Your participant journal is loaded with everything you need to learn more about Lent and to successfully complete each week's challenge."

In our group study we will be working from Tuesday to Tuesday rather than Sunday to Sunday. If you are considering joining the study or plan to join us, please contact Jan Mooney. She can give you a brief description of how the study group functions and will send you the link to join. We look forward to welcoming new members with new ideas to the group.

If you're currently subject to taking an RMD from your rollover IRA or pension plan, you can make any part of your distribution non-taxable if you donate directly to Middle Spring Presbyterian Church. By giving directly from your IRA/pension to the church, the funds you pull out are not taxed, possibly reducing your overall tax bill while you continue making your charitable contribution to MSPC.
