

### Session Highlights for OCTOBER 2024

The September Session meeting was held on October 1 at 6:00 PM in the library/classroom. Danny Chamberlin led the Session in devotions and opened the meeting with prayer.

The *Clerk's report* indicated that Sunday worship continued to be in person but was also offered live at 9:30 AM through Facebook and available on the church's YouTube channel and website. Attendance was as follows:

- 3. The email vote to change the cost of the choir chairs.
- 4. The donation of \$1000 for a filtration system for the kitchen

The Treasurer's report was unavailable because there was inadequate time to prepare the reports for the meeting.

There were 68 drive-thru meals, 12 in-person meals served and 35 meals were taken to the Family Shelter at the September 26, 2024, Community Meal. A pan was taken to the Migrant Camp on October 6, 2024.

Ray Mowery, a representative of the Washingtonburg Chapter of the Sons of American Revolution spoke during worship on September 29 to introduce the congregation to the Wreaths Across America that will be held at Middle Spring at 10:00 on December 14, 2024. You can purchase wreaths on the website for \$17 per wreath.

The Fall Congregational Meeting will be held on November 10, 2024, immediately following worship. The purpose of the meeting will be to present the 2025 Session Approved Budget and to Elect the Ruling Elders, Deacons, and an Auditor for the Class of 2027.

Don Cover resigned from the Nominating Committee for the remainder of 2024.



In addition to the Presbyterian Church's Peace and Global Witness Special Offering, the Session has authorized a Love Offering to be lifted for the Robbie Weber family.

# Want to save taxes on your RMD's (Required Minimum Distribution) while giving to Middle Spring Presbyterian Church?

If you're currently subject to taking an RMD from your rollover IRA or pension plan, you can make any part of your distribution non-taxable if you donate directly to Middle Spring Presbyterian Church. By giving directly from your IRA/pension to the church, the funds you pull out are not taxed, possibly reducing your overall tax bill while you continue making your charitable contribution to MSPC. If you think this is something you'd like more information about the process and the benefits of taking the distribution this way, talk to Pastor Ed, Gary or myself.

### Wreaths Across America



Join us at **10:00** am for a ceremony honoring our fallen veterans. This is part of the nationwide <u>Wreaths Across America</u> program, whose goal is to place wreaths on the graves of as many veterans as possible.

### December 15 White Elephant Gift Exchange

Fellowship after worship will be a luncheon and a White Elephant gift exchange. Bring a gift and enjoy a meal!

### What is a White Elephant gift exchange?

In a White Elephant gift exchange, participants bring wrapped gifts to be selected and stolen from one another. The gift can be something amusing or a practical gift.

### How to play

Each person brings a wrapped gift, and the order of turns is determined by randomly drawing numbers. The first person opens their gift, and the next person can either choose a new gift or steal the first person's. If a gift is stolen, the original owner can choose a new gift or steal from another player. The game ends when everyone has a gift.

### SAFEchild - Technology at SAFEchild Advocacy Center

SAFEchild (Stop Abuse for Every Child) is the leading voice for child abuse prevention through evaluation, intervention and treatment in Wake County, North Carolina. Specialized interviews are often a turning point in children's lives, placing them on a path to recovery. The Thank Offering grant will provide for the purchase of discreet cameras and microphones to record interviews at SAFEchild's advocacy center.

### Forward Paths Foundation, Inc. - Homes to Independence—Housing for Homeless Youth

Forward Paths Foundation works to positively influence at-risk youth in Lake County, Florida, with the support needed to complete high school, attain a consistent work history and learn financial management skills.
